2008 Quinta de Bons-Ventos Tinto (Red)



Lately my "every day" drop of red wine as been a Portugese red wine called Bons Ventos. While Portugal is not normally known as a great wine producing country, this red wine has been great value at \$6.99 at Vintage Cellars for the 2008 vintage. I noticed today that my local First Choice store also has the 2007 Bons Ventos but at \$8 from memory. It's hard to go past this for value. Plenty of fruit without going over the top. Goes well with a steak or pasta. Although I rarely get to find this out with wine, this lasted fine 2 days in the fridge, but by the third it had lost a lot of it's fruit flavours.

It's rare that I buy more than a dozen of any wine, preferring instead to keep variety in my cellar. But with this wine I made an exception. Great value!
