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## Maison Mallard-Gaulin



**Pinot Noir 'Chanceroy' 2006** - lovely fruit (berries & cherries) and herbal notes on the nose, medium body, beautifully balanced with delicate structure, finishes long with very fine tannins. (JPO March 2008).

Aloxe-Corton is home to this family-controlled producer that owns several quality properties in the Côte de Beaune and the Côte de Nuits in Burgundy. They also purchase grapes (but not wine) from contracted and supervised vineyards and are thereby able to offer a wide selection of very well-made, terroir-based AOC wines from Burgundy. As a matter of policy, the domaine seldom exceeds 20% new oak in any cuvée.

The 2005s we tasted at VinExpo were especially delightful, nowhere more evident than the fine red Burgundies of Mallard-Gaulin where the fine work of their young winemaker, Ludevine Griveau, is showing very handsomely.
